

Voluntary Participation

The HCBS Waiver and Community First Choice (CFC) programs are authorized in 1915(c) and 1915(k) of the Social Security Act and allow states to offer services in the community to prevent individuals eligible for Medicaid from being institutionalized. HCBS Waiver recipients must be assessed to meet an Intermediate Care Facility for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF/IID) Level of Care. CFC recipients must be assessed to meet an ICF/IID Level of Care or Nursing Facility Level of Care (NFLOC). Individuals who meet this level of care may choose to receive HCBS Waiver or CFC services in the community as an alternative to a state operated institution.
