Basic Consent Elements Telephone and Mail Surveys Interviews and Focus Groups (Bolded Items are Required Unless Waived by the WSIRB)

- 1. State that the activity involves **research** and **explain why the study is being conducted**.
- 2. **Describe study procedures**, and provide an estimate the **time** required to complete the survey.
- 3. Explain why the individual was selected.
- 4. Provide examples of the most personal and sensitive questions and state that participants may refuse to answer any question or item.
- 5. Describe the **risks or discomforts** (including invasion of privacy) of the research, and how they are minimized.
- 6. Describe the **anticipated benefits** of conducting the study (e.g., in terms of knowledge or program utility).
- 7. Describe **procedures for protecting confidentiality** (or achieving anonymity) of study information.
- 8. State that information about suspected abuse/neglect of children must be reported to Child Protective Services.
- 9. State that study participation is **voluntary** and that subjects **may refuse to participate** or stop the interview at any time with **no penalty**.
- 10. Explain who to contact if they have questions about the study.
