Basic Plus Waiver

Overview

The Basic Plus waiver is one of the DSHS Developmental Disabilities Administration's five federal Home and Community Based Services waivers. This waiver helps people at risk of losing their current living situation. These waiver services help people to meet their health and welfare needs in their own home, their family's home or in other settings.



DDA clients who:

- Meet Social Security Disability criteria.
- Meet Institutional Level of Care criteria.
- Meet income and resource standards for Apple
 Health of Washington. (Client's income and
 resources, not family unit's income and resources.)
- Are a U.S. citizen or federally qualified legal resident.
- Have a DDA Assessment and Person-Centered Service Plan that describe how the participant's health, safety and habilitation needs will be met in the community.
- Accept home and community-based services as an alternative to institutional services.



Budget

The capacity for the Basic Plus waiver is up to 12,439 individuals. In state FY23, 10,911 clients were served on the Basic Plus waiver at an average cost of \$821 per month.

Waivers are limited to the average cost of an Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities for any combination of services necessary to meet the assessed client need. We cannot deny services to people on the waiver due to lack of funding, so waiver costs are carefully monitored.
