

Intensive Habilitation Services for Children

Overview

The DSHS Developmental Disabilities Administration's Intensive Habilitation Services for Children service provides short-term stabilization for children and youth between the ages of 8 to 20. This program provides habilitative goal development, instruction and support for up to 90 days. The client's family, DDA staff and the IHS provider work together to identify client goals. Currently, we have a state-operated provider in Lakewood and one in Spokane. We have funding to develop a third in 2024.

Eligibility

DDA clients who are:

- Eight to 17 years of age or between age 18 and 20 and enrolled in school.
- Approved for waiver stabilization services.
- Not assessed to need inpatient treatment for conditions related to behavioral health or autism as recommended by the client's treating professional.
- Not assessed to need a locked or secure facility and does not require an intervention that is prohibited in a community setting.
- Not a risk to the health or safety of IHS staff or other clients supported by the program.
- Able to have their medication needs met through nurse delegation.

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
