DDA/DVR Intensive Job Placement Plans An Overview

Individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities can thrive in the workforce with consistent opportunities to receive services and reasonable accommodations statewide that are tailored to their unique talents and needs. DDA/DVR Intensive Job Placement services helps support the customers of both the Developmental Disabilities Administration and the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation to gain meaningful employment.

DVR serves as the entry point for employment services, focusing on short-term solutions for successful, competitive integrated community jobs. DVR provides many services including, career guidance and counseling, assessments, job supports, intensive training, retention and post-employment services. DDA

provides long-term funding for customers to access ongoing employment support through county-contracted employment providers.

In some cases, clients with DDA long-term funding may follow a unique pathway to employment that doesn't align with the short-term model. In such instances, utilizing DDA funding to find a job and later collaborating with DVR post-employment is recommended. This approach involves a DDA/DVR Intensive Job Placement Plan, allowing for individualized support on a flexible timeline.

While the traditional DVR job search pathway suits many clients, thoughtful consideration and input from the entire support team are essential when recommending a DDA/DVR Intensive Job Placement Plan.

DVR Financial Statement:

Who can help me with employment?

Your employment provider will support you through every step of the process. They are funded by different sources at different times, depending on where you are in your employment search.

DVR

The Division of Vocational Rehabilitation provides short-term support to help you try jobs, find a job and learn your new job. They also provide job counseling, money for uniforms, accommodations, independent living services and other supports to help you be successful.

County and DDA Services

Your county DD team oversees the services offered by your employment provider, ensures high-quality services are provided and helps brainstorm and problem solve as needed. They can also authorize Individual Technical Assistance if additional support from a consultant would help your job success.
