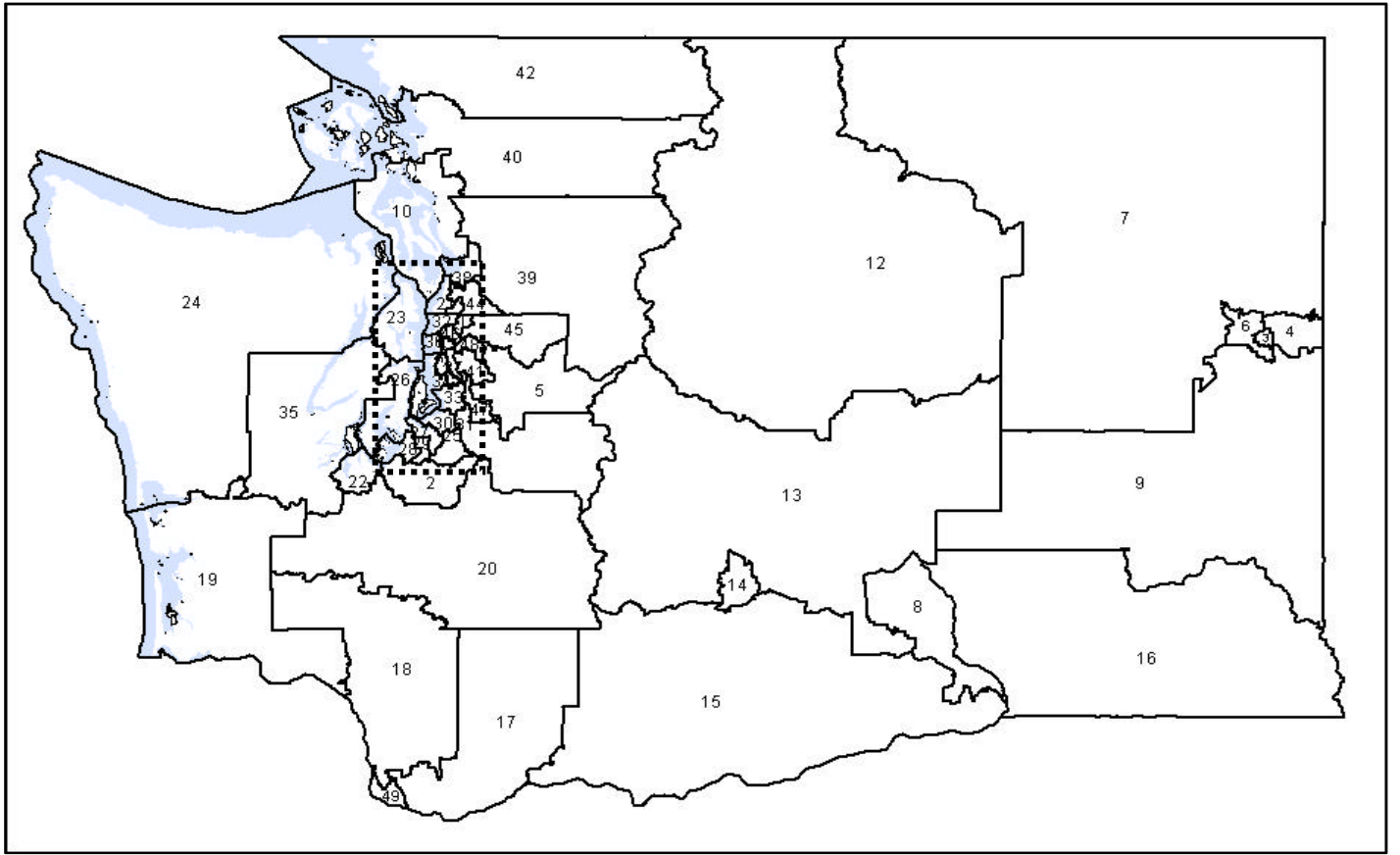

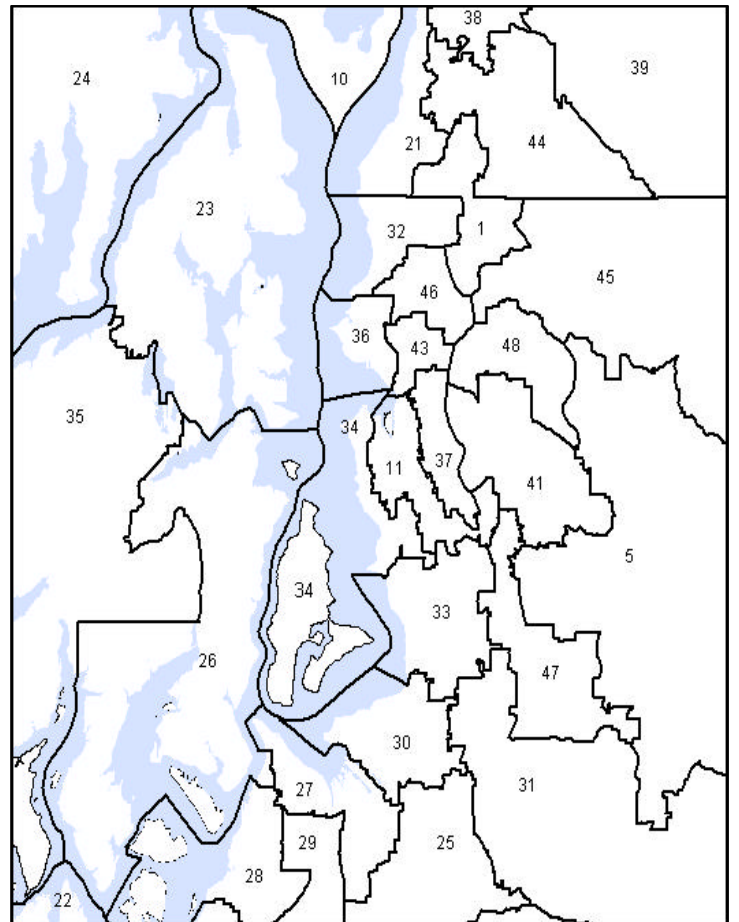

Questions This Report Can Answer

This report shows how the people of each legislative district in Washington State used various economic and medical assistance programs administered by the Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS) during FY94 and FY98. The report answers the following questions for each legislative district and the state as a whole:

- In FY98, how many and what percent of the people in this district used WorkFirst grants (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families or TANF)? In FY94, how many used Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC)? How much was spent on those grants each year?
- In FY98, how many and what percent of the people in this district received Diversion Cash Assistance? How much was spent?
- In FY98, how many and what percent of the people in this district received Consolidated Emergency Assistance Program grants (CEAP)? How much was spent?
- In FY98, how many and what percent of the people in this district received General Assistance Unemployed and Expedited Medical grants (GA-U and GA-X)? In FY94, how many? How much was spent each year?
- In FY98, how many and what percent of the people in this district received General Assistance to Pregnant Women (GA-S)? In FY94, how many? How much was spent each year?
- In FY98, how many and what percent of the people in this district received Refugee Assistance grants? In FY94, how many? How much was spent each year?
- In FY98, how many and what percent of the people in this district received Supplemental Security Income (SSI) from federal and state governments? In FY94, how many? How much was spent in FY98?
- In FY98 and FY94, how many and what percent of the people in this district received Medical Assistance?

SOURCES: Most of the FY98 persons and expenditures are drawn from the Caseload Analysis and Reporting Database (CARD) for the Automated Client Eligibility System (ACES). Exceptions are the Medical Assistance data, which is drawn from Medical Management Information System (MMIS), and the SSI persons and dollars, which are drawn from the State Data Exchange file (SDX). All of the FY94 persons and expenditures were drawn from the FY94 Needs Assessment Database (NADB94), maintained by the DSHS Research and Data Analysis division.

GEOGRAPHY: ACES-CARD, MMIS, SDX and NADB do not record legislative districts, but they do record addresses. A Geographic Information System was used to assign addresses to legislative districts. If the address was a Rural Route Number or Post Office Box, the ZIP code was used to assign legislative districts. If a ZIP code covered more than one legislative district, the district was estimated for that client. The estimation process used census block level populations specified by age, race and gender to “assign” a legislative district to a client.

Services Shown in This Report

WorkFirst (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families-TANF): This DSHS Economic Services Administration (ESA) program provides cash grants to low-income families with children under age 18 (or between 18 and 19 and finishing high school). To receive assistance, the parents or adult caretakers must complete a personal responsibility plan, which includes WorkFirst job search, services that assist persons not finding jobs to find them, on-the-job training and other services. There is a five-year lifetime limit for WorkFirst TANF program, which began August 1, 1997.

Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC): This DSHS-ESA program provided case grants to low-income families with children under age 18 (or between 18 and 19 and finishing high school). There was an associated voluntary job and training program (“JOBS”). There were no lifetime limits for AFDC, which ended July 31, 1997.

Diversion Cash Assistance (DCA): This DSHS-ESA program provides emergency payments of up to \$1500, once in twelve months, to low-income families with temporary needs who are not likely to continue on assistance if those needs are met. The families must be WorkFirst eligible, and if they use WorkFirst within one year of receiving DCA, the DCA grant must be repaid.

Consolidated Emergency Assistance Program (CEAP): This DSHS-ESA program provides emergency, one-month payments to low-income persons who meet WorkFirst income requirements or lack the ability to plan for the emergency.

General Assistance-Unemployable and General Assistance Expedited medical Disability (GA-U and GA-X): These DSHS-ESA programs provide cash grants to clients who are very poor and unable to work due to a physically, mentally, or emotionally incapacitating medical condition. Either the medical condition is not severe or long-term enough to meet federal disability criteria (GA-U), or the client’s case is awaiting SSI determination (GA-X).

General Assistance to Pregnant Women: This DSHS-ESA program provides cash grants to low-income pregnant women who are not eligible for family assistance. Recipients may not be eligible because they are in the first two trimesters of their pregnancy, do not satisfy a categorical eligibility factor to AFDC or TANF, or they relinquish their newborn child for adoption. Grants are continued for an additional six weeks past the birth date for clients who relinquish their children.

Refugee Grants: This DSHS-ESA program provides refugees who meet state income and food standards, but do not qualify for AFDC, TANF or SSI, with federal refugee cash assistance for their first eight months in the United States.

Supplemental Security Income (SSI): The SSI program is a national benefit program for individuals and couples who are age 65 or older, or who are blind or disabled as determined by the Social Security Administration. Most of the expenditure reported here involves federal SSI payments; however, the grant amount also includes the small Washington State SSI supplemental payment which goes to some subgroups of SSI recipients.

Medical Assistance Eligibility: The DSHS Medical Assistance Administration (MAA) assures that necessary medical care is available to eligible low-income persons. Through the Medicaid program, MAA uses both federal and state funds to pay for services to clients who are categorically needy (that is, meet strict federal income and eligibility standards) or medically needy (meet most categorical requirements but have income or assets slightly higher than the allowable limits). Washington State covers the costs of medical care for several additional groups, including some adults (mostly clients using GA-U, ADATSA or Medically Indigent program) and low-income children. The income level for covered children has changed. In FY98, children at or below 200 percent of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) were covered. In FY94, coverage varied by age and income level: below 185 percent of the FPL for birth to age one, 133 percent of the FPL for ages one through five, and 100 percent of the FPL for ages six through 18.
