




Map 1. Washington State Counties




Map 2. Number of Licensed Child Care Centers in 1996




Map 3. Number of Licensed Child Care Homes in 1996




Map 4. Child Care Slots in Licensed Centers in 1996




Map 5. Child Care Slots in Licensed Family Homes in 1996




Map 6. Total Full-time Capacity of Licensed Child Care in 1996




Map 7. Total Child Population (O-12 years)




Map 8. Licensed Child Care Slots Per 100 Children




Map 9. DSHS-Subsidized Children in Licensed Care in 1996
